





STUDENT SUPPORT

From practical advice and guidance to more emotional support, we can provide access to a range of services to enable our students to resolve issues, allowing them to focus on their studies and realise their true potential.

Pastoral Support - support is available to help address a wide range of personal needs and problems. The team are there to support students who are upset, and who might be confused about or struggling with a problem that they could find helpful to discuss with someone outside their circle of family and friends. Liaison with a variety of local specialist support organisations helps us to ensure that where specialist support is required our students are able to access this quickly – with our support should they need it.

Health and Wellbeing - the team can offer advice on a range of practical strategies to support both a healthy mind and body.

Counselling - a confidential service offering a range of strategies to help students address emotional distress arising from psychological, emotional or mental health issues.

Money Matters - from emergency loans to advice on longer-term support and budgeting as well as advice on applying for student finance if moving onto university. At The Northern School of Art we believe in fostering independence and supporting students to grow and achieve, not only academically, but also personally.

The Student Services Team provide support for students from application, throughout their time at the School and onwards towards their next steps whether that be to University, or into employment or supported internships.

Transition Support - for learners who may require a little more time or information before studying with us, we can arrange visits and taster sessions to gain more insight into what it is like studying at the School. We work with schools to facilitate access from year 9 onwards.

Learning Support - our SENDco and team of Learning Support Assistants ensure that any students with special educational needs are fully supported in and out of the studios and classrooms. Liaising with schools, families and the local authorities, where required, we ensure we provide the most appropriate means of support for students with additional needs and those with Educational Health Care Plans to achieve their goals and ambitions.

Specialist Learning Support - available for students with dyslexia or related learning difficulties, specialist support is provided on a one-to-one basis and supports students in areas such as planning and organisation skills, reading and spelling strategies and general study skills.

Duration Part-Time, 1 Year (2.5 days per week)

Entry Requirements Age 19+ yrs

UCAS Points Up to 144 (depending on grade outcome) The award-winning Access to HE programme is a highly supportive course designed to provide learners (19+ years) with the opportunity to get back into education and training.

The programme excels in building students' confidence, employability skills and professionalism through creative practice, live briefs and competitions.

Your successful completion of this course will provide you with your own individual creative portfolio and the skills you need to progress to a wide range of degrees at university or a Master's if you already have a degree in a non-art & design subject.

Students will produce a very diverse portfolio of Art & Design work focussing on their interests and strengths.

Tutors are committed to providing an amazing student experience and supporting students to achieve. The course features a tailored approach to learning and progression routes that sets it apart from other education providers.

The course prepares students for a range of professional careers; some of these have included illustrator, prop maker, textiles and surface designer, community artist, teacher, concept artist, photographer and fashion designer.

FOUNDATION DIPLOMA IN ART & DESIGN

Jemma Ooi, Royal College of Art, Co-founder of CUSTHOM interior design studios The well-established Foundation course is designed for post A level (or equivalent) 18-year-old students, to provide a unique transitionary year between 6th form/college and creative degrees at university. It's an intensive experience that enables you to develop your own individual creative identity and discover which art & design discipline best suits you and equips you with the skills and confidence to apply to and thrive at university on any of the many creative degrees available nationally and internationally.

In the first 6-8 weeks you will try out all the different art & design areas, working with a multi-disciplinary approach to extend your creative practice in experimental and innovative ways.

Foundation immerses you in a range of exploratory activities, which develop skills and introduce new techniques, new approaches and, most importantly, new ways of seeing the world. You will develop high levels of critical thinking and creative interpretation and gain an understanding of how to work with creatives across all disciplines.

Throughout, you'll follow an intensive programme of drawing, including life drawing. You will also have the potential opportunity to explore a wide range of specialist techniques, including ceramics, painting, photography, screen printing, animation and illustration.

A 3-PART COURSE

Part 1 Investigation into Creative Practice: the first 6-8 weeks of creative activities will guide you to explore approaches and processes intrinsic to all areas of Art & Design.

You will learn more about the creative and design process, to think outside the box, to work openmindedly and experientially, and you'll learn to reflect on and challenge your own thinking.

Part 2 Developing Practice: you will develop your skills and creative identity across a range of holistic multi-disciplinary activities, producing work to pursue your creative progression goals.

Your pathway tutor supports you through the UCAS application and interview process to achieve your aims.

Part 3 Consolidating Practice: the final part and the only graded part of the course. You'll design and complete your own project, which will showcase your learning as a part of the Diploma Exhibition.

Foundation, which is free to those aged under 19 years old, helps you avoid costly mistakes by enabling you to be sure of your subject choice at degree level. We have excellent rates of progression to our higher education campus and top universities across the country, including The Royal College of Art, UAL Central St Martins, Edinburgh School of Art, Falmouth School of Art, The University of Oxford, The Slade School of Fine Art University College London and Glasgow School of Art.

Our students enjoy a range of careers or further study, including graphic design, 3D & product design, automotive designer, costume, fine art, painting & print-making, interior design, fashion, textiles, illustration, architecture, photography, set design and fashion.

LEVEL 2 DIPLOMA ART & DESIGN



Duration Full-Time, 1 Year

Billy Cessford, prop designer, BCFX The Level 2 Diploma: Art & Design course is designed for those students who wish to build their academic qualifications – offering a chance to achieve the equivalent of 4 GCSEs in creative subjects.

In safe, creative, spacious studios, you will work with highly experienced tutors, who will support and help you to develop your skills and knowledge.

Professional creatives and tutors will help and support you in exploring academic knowledge and practical creative skills, including:

- Drawing
- Painting
- Sculpture
- Graphic Design
- Illustration

- Surface Design
- Fashion
- 3D Design
- Photography

You will be shown how you can express individual ideas and thoughts through a wide range of art & design skills and techniques. You will create a portfolio of work that will reflect your unique potential within art & design and enable you to study further or gain employment. You will also explore the work of other artists and designers and learn how they have made a career in their chosen field. This work is supported by educational visits to galleries and other cultural places of interest, where you will have the opportunity to participate in industry-led projects and competitions, which have included the 'Sketch for Survival' competition, postcard designs for sale in Whitby Wildlife Sanctuary shop, donated work for Purquoise Mental Health Charity online exhibition and auction, as well as talks from ex-students and creative professionals.

All of this is managed by highly creative and experienced tutors, who will support and help you to develop your skills as well as helping you to gain confidence on both a personal and creative level. Our studios are creative and stimulating places to work in and our excellent resources and space ensure that you can develop your talent in a safe, comfortable, spacious environment. Maths and English are provided as additional studies to the main course and are compulsory for those students who don't already hold a GCSE in these subjects at grade 4 (C) or above. You may also have the opportunity to exhibit your work in the exciting end-of-year Summer Show exhibition.

Tutors will also ensure that you receive the right support and guidance to progress to further courses or employment. If you successfully complete this course, as long as you possess the necessary Maths and English qualifications, you can apply for a specialist Level 3 within the School.



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ACTING FOR STAGE & SCREEN



Duration Diploma Full-Time, 1 Year

Extended Diploma Full-Time, 2 Years

Entry Requirements 4 GCSEs (9-4/A*-C)

UCAS Points Up to 168 (depending on grade outcome)

You will complete the Diploma programme in your first year, before typically progressing onto the second year of study to complete the Extended Diploma or, if you wish, progress onto other courses, apprenticeships or employment.

NEW COURSE

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The Level 3 Diploma and Extended Diploma in Acting for Stage & Screen is designed to provide students with the knowledge, skills and understanding necessary to access and progress to degree-level study or employment in the performing arts.

The course provides an opportunity for those who have an interest in the performing arts to explore, develop and test their creativity within a qualification structure that is stimulating and demanding and provides a supportive transition from general to more specialised study.

On this highly practical course you will have the opportunity to explore a wide range of different acting techniques for both stage and screen. You will look at contemporary and classical texts as well as devise your own performance pieces supported by experienced lecturers.

The first year will look at the core skills of actor training – voice, physicality and characterisation – which you can then apply to a variety of projects. All of this practical exploration will be supported by developing knowledge of the theoretical underpinning of different practitioners such as Stanislavski, Brecht and Lecoq.

The second year will allow you the opportunity to develop the skills gained in the first year. You will be working on classical theatre and also focussing on audition preparation to ensure you are prepared for your next steps whether into industry or higher education. This skills-based approach will be supplemented by a number of performance opportunities.





LEVEL 3 DIPLOMA ART & DESIGN



Duration Diploma Full-Time, 1 Year

Extended Diploma Full-Time, 2 Years

Entry Requirements 4 GCSEs (9-4/A*-C)

UCAS Points Up to 168 (depending on grade outcome)

You will complete the Diploma programme in your first year, before typically progressing onto the second year of study to complete the Extended Diploma or, if you wish, progress onto other courses, apprenticeships or employment. This course offers wide-ranging opportunities for you to explore a diverse range of career options within the creative industries. If you are still unsure of a specific area of study, this is the course for you. It encourages individuality to allow you to explore a wide range of artistic skills and experiences, allowing you more time to experiment and consider your creative career options.

You are encouraged to take an individual approach towards your assignments, which are designed to challenge your creative thinking and uniqueness.

You will explore all disciplines in the first year to allow you to make informed decisions on your progression and specialism in the second year.

Workshops include illustration, graphics, photography, fine art, sculpture, print for illustration/textiles/fashion and 3D & 4D creative processes. Individuality and interests are encouraged.

Students are encouraged to take part in a range of work experience and professional 'live briefs' to gain experience for future careers or study; these have included:

- Circus an exhibition including costume design, illustration, 3D installation
- Wintertide Festival with 'BloomInArts' an arts development company working with community groups and local schools
- Graffiti design and spray-painting at the local skate park
- TopShop, Metro Centre design and sale of children's toys
- The Festival of Thrift young voices

In addition to this, you will learn how to use computers as design and drawing tools, explore working in the community and art education, and experiment with both 2D and 3D outcomes.

You will benefit from a number of educational visits to explore local and regional artistic talent, meet clients who provide live briefs, work closely with schools and the community on projects, and enjoy working in a creatively charged studio with like-minded people.

Successful completion of the course gives the qualifications and skills required to progress onto a broad range of degree courses such as fashion, textiles, production design, arts management, graphics, costume, illustration, photography, fine art, comic illustration, animation, production for stage and screen, theatre, film, model making, special effects, ceramics or teaching.





COSTUME DESIGN



Duration Diploma Full-Time, 1 Year

Extended Diploma Full-Time, 2 Years

Entry Requirements 4 GCSEs (9-4/A*-C)

UCAS Points Up to 168 (depending on grade outcome)

You will complete the Diploma programme in your first year, before typically progressing onto the second year of study to complete the Extended Diploma or, if you wish, progress onto other courses, apprenticeships or employment.

NEW COURSE

This course will provide you with an exciting introduction and overview of the process of costume design. The British Film Institute (BFI) has identified skills shortages in costume at a national level and this course will get you started on a career path leading to film, TV, stage and many other possibilities.

You will gain an understanding of the design process and develop the practical skills for creating costumes, clothing and accessories for use in the screen and stage industries.

This is a new course that brings together skills from across clothing and costume to help you create a vibrant and imaginative portfolio of costume design.

The course will provide you with the skills to:

- gather historical research to develop and communicate ideas through sketchbooks, 2D storyboards and costume designs
- · analyse a script for character interpretation
- costume construction skills
- gain an understanding of the role and responsibilities of the costume designer

You will cover a range of techniques including clothing sketching, garment construction, fabric investigation, embellishment, embroidery, accessories, traditional textiles and other materials including leather or metal. The first year of this course shares teaching with our Fashion or Textiles courses as there are many common foundational skills. This also means that at the end of the first year students can easily change their specialism if they wish to.

You will learn in specialist workshops and studios throughout the course with access to industry-standard equipment; our tutors are specialists who have a wide range of industry experience. Projects with external organisations will be encouraged to ensure you experience 'real-world' design opportunities. You will have the opportunity to create and display your final design in the School's Summer Show and potentially support other courses to produce costumes for acting or film course productions.

The course provides a valuable start for students wishing to enjoy a career in clothing and costume management or design for heritage, self-employed business/entrepreneurship, interpretation, stage or screen, including the opportunity to create an exciting portfolio of work for your next steps in your chosen career or to apply higher education courses at degree level.







3D DESIGN (INTERIORS, ARCHITECTURE & PRODUCTIONS)



Duration Diploma Full-Time, 1 Year

Extended Diploma Full-Time, 2 Years

Entry Requirements 4 GCSEs (9-4/A*-C)

UCAS Points Up to 168 (depending on grade outcome)

You will complete the Diploma programme in your first year, before typically progressing onto the second year of study to complete the Extended Diploma or, if you wish, progress onto other courses, apprenticeships or employment. This course offers you the opportunity to develop your skills and interests into a lucrative career in industries such as interior design, architecture, exhibition design, theatre and TV production design.

The course is ideal for those students who have a practical mind, really enjoy making and building things and seeing their ideas develop into working models and prototypes. Students will benefit from exciting opportunities to collaborate with other courses in the School to develop full-scale prop and set designs within an entertainment-industry context.

Working in dedicated specialist studios and workshops equipped with an extensive range of industry-standard equipment, students will explore a fascinating range of materials and making processes, including laser-cutting, 3D printing and virtual reality as well as traditional techniques such as white card and colour model making. Students will learn how to create, develop and enhance their designs using traditional techniques and digital software such as Photoshop and Blender.

Typically, the course offers many opportunities for excellent industrial links and 'live projects' set by architects and designers, who will help develop students' ideas professionally. Students may also benefit from a range of educational visits to gather first-hand research and to experience design in its many forms; these have included trips to Northern Design Festival, Harry Potter World and the Yorkshire Sculpture Park amongst others.

Students on this course have progressed to a range of training and higher education institutions, including Glasgow School of Art.

Duration Diploma Full-Time, 1 Year

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Fashion is a powerful art form; it allows us to express ourselves through the clothes that we design and wear.

This fashion course will give you an excellent understanding of the whole design process through specialist teaching that covers fashion sketching, garment construction, technical investigation, fabric manipulation, portfolio building, and fashion promotion and styling.

The course will give you a well-rounded education to help you understand the many areas of the fashion industry and is ideal for anyone wishing to embark on a career in fashion.

Emphasis is placed on professional practice as you work in a studio full of industry-standard equipment. There may be opportunities to take part in educational visits to international centres of fashion excellence such as Paris and London. Successful completion of the course provides the qualifications and skills required to progress onto a range of degree courses or go directly into employment.

FILM & TV PRODUCTION



Duration Diploma Full-Time, 1 Year

Extended Diploma Full-Time, 2 Years

Entry Requirements 4 GCSEs (9-4/A*-C)

UCAS Points Up to 168 (depending on grade outcome)

You will complete the Diploma programme in your first year, before typically progressing onto the second year of study to complete the Extended Diploma or, if you wish, progress onto other courses, apprenticeships or employment.

This course allows you to work on a variety of different creative projects such as short films, documentaries, single camera drama, film trailers, social media content creation and creative filmmaking.

You will learn to script, plan and story board, use camera equipment, edit film and work with audio to ensure you have a good understanding of the variety of skills used within the film and TV industries. You will have opportunities to explore lots of different skills and creative techniques, combining theory and practice. By the end of this course, you will be confident, creative moving-image producers with a practical understanding of industry processes and techniques.

As well as industry skill sets, the course also provides a wide range of opportunities for students who are focussed on conceptual exploration of moving-image production, where learners are provided with the choice to study a variety of assignments, such as advertising, documentary and fine art film making.

Group work is essential, so you will quickly make new friends while learning the creative and technical skills necessary for industry. Projects are designed to give you an insight into varying careers within the film, TV and online broadcast industries. These include camera operators, editors, directors, producers, cinematographers and more.

The course enjoys a range of industry links that provide 'live projects' and work experience, including Ithica Films, Sport TV production and Siren Media. Projects have included working with The White Feather Project (Pallister Park), Crisis (Newcastle) and Camphill Village Trust (Hemlington), Rose Cottage Wellness Centre and 'Enter CIC'.

Students also enjoy a range of talks from industry speakers, including Tom Marshall (alumni, Writer & Director, Channel 4, BBC3, Apple TV and Netflix), Jeannie Finlay, Izak Jackson (VoltaMedia) and Caris Rianne (Rianne Pictures).

The film and television industry is a hugely active sector within the creative industries and has grown year on year, contributing approximately £6.1 billion to the UK's economy in the year prior to Covid. The industry is emerging from lockdown and we are confident the demand for skilled creative professionals will continue.

You will discover how to turn ideas and experiments into professional outcomes using our suite of Apple Mac computers and Mac Books and be taught how to use industry standard Adobe Creative Cloud Suite.

On this course you will work on a variety of projects, including live briefs with real clients, with the opportunity to collaborate with a wide range of industry contacts for projects, workshops, talks and studio visits. If you are also interested in how social media can be used to create exciting and engaging content for promotion and advertisin, then this is the course for you.

After exploring both areas of graphic design or illustration-led styles within your first year, you will have the confidence to respond to projects more independently and within your specialist practice within graphic design in your second year.

The course is designed to be responsive to the latest developments in the industry as well as building in the opportunities for you to react creatively to current issues around the world, considering aspects such as globalisation and social design theories.

Successful completion of the course will give you the skills and qualifications required to go directly into industry or progress to a range of degree courses, including:

You will create designs in our dedicated studios, developing your own personal creative voice, while being supported to improve your drawing, design and employability skills.

Throughout the course you will be given the opportunity to create:

- 2D traditional and digital animations
- commercial illustrations
- graphic novel designs

- stop-motion animations
- storyboarding
- concept art for film,
 - animation and games.

You will gain technical experience using industry-standard software, including Photoshop, After Effects, and the full Adobe Creative Suite before moving on to advanced 3D modelling using Blender in the second year of the course.

There will also be opportunities for excellent industry links and live projects set by professional working designers who will help develop your ideas.

You may also benefit from a range of enhancements to the course, including life drawing and educational visits, to gather first-hand research and experience design in its many forms. Recent trips include Yorkshire Sculpture Park and MIMA.



This wide ranging and innovative course provides you with the opportunity to explore the creative world of photography.

Photographs and images are, as everyone knows, part of everyday life. This course will provide you with the opportunity to engage with the language of photography and imagery via a series of assignments specifically written to broaden your outlook. The list of potential subjects is almost endless, as are the learning prospects on this course.

You will explore the full range of darkroom and digital techniques (including moving image and camera-less photography), giving you a thorough understanding of the possibilities of their uses. Alongside a technical understanding, research and experimentation is greatly pursued. Research is intended to understand and challenge historical and contemporary concepts inside and outside of the photographic landscape. We encourage and implement thinking that expands on the wider culture context. Experimentation is formatted within a reflective cycle, in which acts of practice are inspired by reflection on practice, practice on reflection.

Students have access to a fully equipped store which has a range of analogue and digital cameras available to borrow. Students also have access to a darkroom and professional photographic studio. You will explore the work of both commercial and fine art photographers, typically, through educational visits, live briefs and visiting photographers, recent projects have included working with Ageing Better and The Bowes Museum. We are intending to provide a range of work experience projects for students to gain valuable professional experience, these may include local galleries Pineapple Black, Auxiliary Gallery and Psyche Clothing Store.

The course will expand your imagination and skills through workshops delivered by industry professionals, whilst getting full support for progression into higher education and degree courses or the many varied roles within the photographic industry.

The course offers you the opportunity to explore a wide range of career pathways, including textiles for:

- products
- interior accessories
- costumes
- fashion accessories & jewellery
- textiles art
- surface design & print for fashion, costume, gift wrap, wallpaper and interior fabrics
- innovative surfaces
- print and illustration

You will have opportunities to use traditional and non-traditional textile media, such as paper, fabrics, metal, glass and ceramics.

You will explore a variety of drawing and printing techniques, digital and surface embellishment, to enhance design ideas for areas such as interior and fashion accessories, and handmade bespoke work. Students will have access to opportunities such as live assignments and competitions, including The Knitting & Stitching Show, UAL Origins, and social enterprise 'Barefoot Kitchen'. Live assignments with Walker & Wolfe and collaborations with BA (Hons) Textiles & Surface Design students at the Premier Vision trade show as well as live sustainability collaborations with charity shop distribution centres.

You will also have access to live talks and workshops with industry specialists, including designers, artists and photographers.

You will gain invaluable knowledge and skills in how to become textile makers and/or surface designers through exploration, in specialist studios and workshops, experiencing and combining a wide range of mixed-media textile techniques, materials and equipment used within the art & design industries.

During your time with us, you will receive an exciting, broad experience and knowledge of 2D & 3D textile materials and processes in year 1, which becomes individually and independently focused throughout year 2, and is designed to enhance and develop your chosen area of textiles and career specialism, within the textile design and art and craft industries.

Our students progress to a range of careers and destinations, including studying degree level at the School, as well as Manchester Metropolitan University, Leeds Arts University and De Montfort University.

Welcome to our specialist A-Level Pathways

On the A-level pathway, students have access to a range of workshops and skills talks provided by practicing professionals from across the creative industries as well as higher education and degree-level lecturers - each session provides essential advice and insight into planning for a successful career as a creative professional.

Our students progress to a wide range of different study and learning, including The University of York, Leeds Arts University, University Arts London, York St John University, Manchester Metropolitan University, as well as The Northern School of Art degree programmes.

Our A-level students are encouraged to participate in a range of activities to support their understanding of creative arts and their future career and job roles. Students on the A-level pathways have also successfully taken part in national competitions, such as The Knitting & Stitching Show, created video content for the Department of Education and taught online to primary schools.

We also think it is really important to explore the issues that impact on our students and recent teaching modules have explored knife crime, environmental issues and art, social media and its impact on mental health.

Over the following pages, find out more about our specialist A-Level Pathway which provides our students with an exciting introduction to their creative career.

PATH WAYS

As a student of creative subjects, it is very important to explore and identify your strengths and creative options.

Being a specialist arts institution, we have our own approach towards delivering A levels which will provide you with an enhanced experience of creative education.

On our A level programme you will study:

- **1.** a Visual Arts pathway
- **2.** a Design pathway
- **3.** and an academic subject of your choice.

What are these 'pathways'?

In previous years, while learning more about the creative industries, many of our students asked to change subjects after becoming interested in other skills, and this was not possible for us to arrange..

So we decided to expand the curriculum for our students, which allows a greater exploration of skills and more flexibility. Typically within the Visual Arts pathway you will combine the traditional topics of Fine Art and Photography. In the Design pathway, you will study Graphic Communication and Textiles Design.

You will study all subjects for the full two years, though in the second year you will be able to select a subject to specialise in from each pathway. As an example, you might select Photography, Textiles Design and English.



What are the benefits of this approach?

- You will learn where your true strengths and passions are, which will help you decide upon your next steps.
- You will have a much wider portfolio, which will support progression into employment or continued education.
- You will gain more time with tutors with a diverse range of skills from different creative industries.
- You will gain a greater understanding of the creative industries e.g. how subjects are influenced by other disciplines.

COMMON QUESTIONS

I don't like drawing; do I have to attend the Fine Art lessons if I only want to study Photography?

We understand some learners have this mindset; however, there are many fine art photographers within the creative industries. By studying this pathway you will double your skill set. There is much more to Fine Art than drawing, and the same goes for any other subject.

Does studying all of these subjects mean I'll have to do more work?

No, the curriculum is designed so that our lecturers work together. You could be working on one project in any pathway, e.g. using both Graphic Communication skills and Textiles skills in the Design Pathway.

When I pick my specialist topics in the second year, does that mean I drop the other subjects?

No. You will continue to attend all lessons, but if you decide you want to focus on Photography and Graphic Communication, for example, then your tutors will support you so that you can develop and focus your skills in these particular areas.

I want to study both English and the History of Art & Design. Is this possible?

We are one of only two specialist arts schools in the country. Delivering an arts education is what we do best! Which is why we primarily focus on developing the creative skills of our learners. Therefore, it is not possible to select both the academic subjects, but, as you will learn on the separate pathways, you will continuously develop your English skills and your knowledge of Art & Design History at the same time.





At The Northern School of Art, we offer two very popular Saturday Morning Art Clubs (10am-1pm).

• 6-11 yrs (Key Stage 1 & 2)

- Parents are not required to stay for the duration of the class.
- We ask that students bring with them refreshments for break time and wear old clothes that they don't mind getting messy.



Interview

Interviews normally start in October and take place throughout the year. However, we encourage you to apply as soon as possible.

Interviews at The Northern School of Art are friendly and informal and will usually be with a a relevant course teacher. Interviews take place in a relaxed environment and are designed to guide you on the most suitable route.

At interview you will be asked general questions regarding your application to us and some questions about yourself, your inspirations and aspirations. We ask you to bring some examples of your own work in the form of a portfolio. The most important thing about this interview is to just be yourself and not to worry. The idea behind your interview is to show us the kinds of things you are interested in, for us to see how passionately you talk about your work and to help us make sure we find the best course to suit you.

Portfolio advice

A portfolio is individual to every student and it is difficult to say exactly what it should consist of. Everyone will have individual styles and will have been taught to produce work in different ways. We encourage you to bring anything that you feel will help support your application to The Northern School of Art.

It is a good idea to order your work in a way that will make it easier to talk through, e.g. you may want to begin with work that you produced at the very start of your current studies.

Portfolio work may include any of the following:

- drawings
- paintings
- sketchbook work
- digital design work
- photographs
- short video clips
- animations
- screen prints
- research notes
- examples of blog work
- fabric/sewing work
- 3D sculpture work
- examples of mixed media

After the interview

If you are successful at interview, you will be offered a place. We will then keep in touch with you throughout the year until you enrol with us.

Worried about your portfolio?

If you're concerned about your portfolio or worried there isn't much work to show us, don't panic. We would still encourage you to apply and attend the interview. If we feel that you should submit more work to us, then we will request this from you before making a firm decision. If we feel that you may be better suited to an alternative course, we will provide appropriate advice and guidance - whether this is a course with us or elsewhere.
